Leadership Message

This past year began for the YWCA with a prior operating deficit of close to \$300,000 and the prospect of funding cuts, program reductions, and staff layoffs. It was without a doubt a very hard beginning.

Every department of the YWCA faced challenges. Our childcare centres and school-based before- and after-school programs struggled with slow enrolment and with expenses that escalated higher than fees could be raised. Programs had to be cut and closed, long term staff had to be let go.

Expanding our services for youth was identified as a priority in the YWCA's 2013 to 2018 strategic plan, and for two years we invested substantially in developing and launching new programs for pre-teen and teenage girls. But program development and start-up costs money. In 2015 it was money that the YWCA didn't have, so only those programs that were externally funded were maintained.

Huge changes were pending for many of the YWCA's homelessness and housing programs, our funders' expectations of program and funding models for emergency shelters and supportive housing came under review. At the beginning of 2015, we knew that our emergency shelter funding would be reduced, and that some shelter staff would have to be laid off. We also knew that 2015 might be the final year for our largest supportive housing contract. We had successfully completed a pre-qualification bid to enter into a new, enhanced contract, but were still awaiting the outcome of our formal proposal.

It was, indeed, a very challenging start to the year, but gradually things got better. By the end of 2015, enrolment in our childcare and before-and after-school programs was



climbing, and improved funding for infant and toddler care – services that the YWCA had offered at a loss for many years – was promised for 2016.

We were thrilled to receive a two-year grant from the Trillium Foundation that allowed us to continue and significantly expand a successful program for pre-teen girls from marginalized communities; a program that had been scheduled to close due to lack of funding.

We finished 2015 with a small deficit, but one that was a fraction of the prior year's. This was due to the hard work of our staff and Finance Committee. Our emergency shelter continued to struggle with the changes resulting from a loss of funding as well as a reduction in staff. Moving forward we will need to increase our fundraising for this program to keep it going in the future. That said, we were ultimately successful in our supportive housing proposal, and in a separate proposal for capital funding to construct a new four-plex for large families living in low income. So, in 2016, we will be expanding one housing program and adding two new ones.

To all of our dedicated volunteers, donors, champions and stakeholders – thank you! Thank you for believing in us and for supporting us as we strive to achieve our good ending. We appreciate you!


